It's simple: Don't pay property taxes for three years, and Wayne County forecloses on the property — whether it's a vacant lot or a crumbling warehouse. If an owner can't take care of the delinquent taxes or get into a payment plan, the county auctions the house off.

Tax foreclosure

Just like last year, over 60,000 properties are receiving tax foreclosure notices...And an estimated 40,000-plus are homes with people living in them...

Every October, people wake up to find their homes auctioned off on the Internet.



Loveland's first foray into Detroit real estate was a \$500 vacant lot...It put 10,000 square inches up for sale at \$1 apiece and called it 'inchvesting'... "It was very much like an improv art project..." Paffendorf says. Some longtime residents raised eyebrows...but with it, Loveland was born.


Loveland today

Big data offers us a window on the world. But large and easily available datasets may not show us the world we live in...For data analytics to be useful, it needs to be theory- or problem-driven, not simply driven by data that is easily available.

Why is it important?

"The Tricycle Collective is a perfect example of using Loveland's data to affect real people's lives. [The founder] zeroes in on neighborhoods and uses Loveland's maps to find homes that are in the auction and then goes and canvases those neighborhoods to talk with residents — preferably those with children — about their options."
